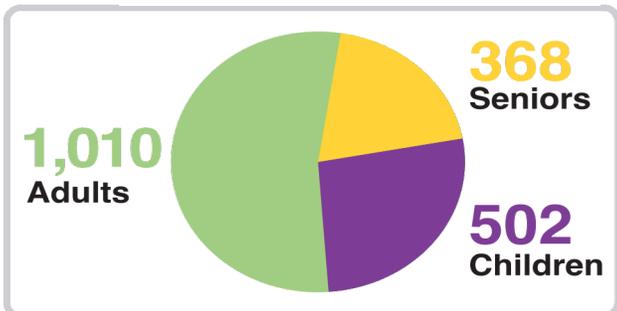

1,880 Neighbors Served	Unduplicated individuals served (households and all registered household members)
26,907 Times	Total instances of food provided to duplicated households and individuals
13,011 Shopping Visits	Unduplicated shopping visits by heads of households, including onsite programs (appointments, walk ins, curbside) and off-site programs (mobile, home delivery, weekend backpacks)
898 Households	Unduplicated households registered with The Pantry
626,032 lbs = 521,693 meals	1.2 pounds equals 1 meal according to Feeding America
12,855 hours of work valued at \$540,000	The estimated value of a volunteer hour in Massachusetts is \$42.00. This figure, based on 2024 data, is calculated by Independent Sector and the Do Good Institute at the University of Maryland
